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8 CALL TO ORDER: The public hearing was called to order by Presiding Officer Robert Kohlsdorf at
9 6:02 PM.

10
11 ROLL CALL: Assembly members present: John WINKLMANN, Gordon CARLSON, Robert
12 KOHLSDORF, Clay WALKER, Terry ASBURY, Paddy TATUM and Rusty LASELL. Absent: Cyrus
13 COOPER, David EVANS

14
15 ORDINANCE 11-24, Version E: An ordinance amending Denali Borough Code of Ordinances,
16 Chapter 6.15 adding Section 6.15.071 titled Regulated Medical Waste.

17
18 There was no public comment.

19
20 ORDINANCE 12-01, Version B: An ordinance amending the Denali Borough Code of Ordinances,
21 Chapter 3.21 titled Management of Grants.

23 There was no public comment.

24
25 ORDINANCE 12-04, Version C: An ordinance amending the Denali Borough Code of Ordinances,
26 Chapter 3.25.100 titled Penalties and Interest.

28 There was no public comment.

30 ORDINANCE 12-06, Version A: An ordinance amending Denali Borough Code, Chapter 2.05.050

35 ORDINANCE 12-07, Version A: An ordinance amending the fiscal year 2012 budget.

37 Steve Love, Tri-Valley Volunteer Fire Department (TVVFD) Board member, spoke in support of
38 funding for the TVVFD summer ETT intern program. The Department has raised \$8,400 toward
39 their goal of \$10,000.

40
41 ORDINANCE 12-08, Version A: An ordinance for the establishment and adoption of the fiscal year
42 2013 budget.

43
44 Steve Love, TVVFD Board member, spoke in support of increasing the amount budgeted for
45 contribution to TVVFD.

1 Teri Simmons, Denali Chamber of Commerce Board member, thanked the Assembly for funding
2 provided in Fiscal Year (FY) 2012, and asked that funding for the Chamber of Commerce be
3 included in the FY 2013 budget.

4
5 Rebecca Galasso, Denali Chamber of Commerce Board member, spoke in support of funding the
6 Chamber of Commerce in FY 2013.

7
8 ORDINANCE 12-09, Version A: An ordinance establishing the Denali Borough Capital Improvement
9 program for fiscal year 2013 through fiscal year 2018.

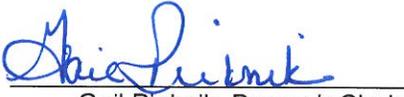

**Minutes of the Regular Meeting
Denali Borough Assembly
Tri-Valley Community Center
May 09, 2012**

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7 CALL TO ORDER: Presiding Officer Robert KOHLSDORF called the regular meeting to order at
8 6:11 PM. Mayor David Talerico led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance.
9

10 ROLL CALL:

11 Assembly members present: Clay WALKER, Paddy TATUM, John WINKLMANN, Robert
12 KOHLSDORF, Gordon CARLSON, Terry ASBURY, Rusty LASELL. Absent: Cyrus COOPER and
13 David EVANS.
14

15 Clay WALKER MOVED to excuse Mr. Evans. Rusty LASELL seconded. The VOTE by show of
16 hands was unanimous.
17

18 John WINKLMANN MOVED to excuse Mr. Cooper. Terry ASBURY seconded. The VOTE was 4-3
19 as follows: Yes – Paddy TATUM, Terry ASBURY, John WINKLMANN, Robert KOHLSDORF; No –
20 Gordon CARLSON, Rusty LASELL, and Clay WALKER. The motion passed.
21

22 PUBLIC COMMENTS

23 David Coleman, Healy resident and Nenana Canyon business owner, spoke in support of a well in
24 the Nenana Canyon that would serve businesses in the area. Mr. Coleman pointed out that
25 Resolution 11-26, which was passed in January, requested State funding for a community well in the
26 Cantwell community. Businesses in the Nenana Canyon would partner with the Borough on such a
27 project.
28

29 Bill Berglin, Grande Denali Lodge, spoke in support of a well in the Nenana Canyon that would serve
30 businesses in the area. Mr. Berglin stated that his company has drilled two wells that are
31 inadequate for the needs of his business, and that water is supplemented from Kingfisher Creek.
32 Recent changes in ownership of a water source are causing this to be an urgent situation, and a
33 permanent solution is needed.
34

35 Chris Scheffer, General Manager of Denali Bluffs and Grande Denali hotels, spoke in support of a
36 well in the Nenana Canyon that would serve businesses in the area.
37

38 Will Lausen, Healy resident, expressed concern that Borough Landfill employees work on personal
39 vehicles in the Landfill shop using Borough tools.
40

41 Armeda Bulard, Cantwell resident, spoke to Resolution 12-13 regarding development of shooting
42 ranges. Ms. Bulard stated that the Cantwell community, with the assistance of Mayor Talerico,
43 formed a non-profit organization which is independent of the Borough to build a shooting range. Ms.
44 Bulard questioned the dollar amount included in the resolution, and urged the use of Borough-owned
45 land and volunteer recruitment if the project is pursued.
46

1 Leroy Lausen, owner of Lausen's Dependable Disposal, spoke in opposition to Ordinance 11-24
2 regarding regulated medical waste. Mr. Lausen stated that the ordinance was not consistent in
3 application, affecting a few and not all equally.

4
5 Molly McKinley, Panguingue Creek Subdivision resident, introduced herself to the Assembly, and
6 thanked them for considering her application to be appointed to the Planning Commission (Seat F).

7 8 AGENDA

9 Clay WALKER MOVED to approve the agenda as submitted. Rusty LASELL seconded. John
10 WINKLMANN MOVED to add Sean Dewalt, Risk Control Specialist with Alaska Municipal League
11 Joint Insurance Agency (AMLJIA) under Communications and Appearances. Gordon CARLSON
12 seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous. The VOTE by show of hands to approve
13 the agenda was unanimous.

14 15 MINUTES

16 April 11, 2012 Assembly Public Hearing-

17 Rusty LASELL MOVED to approve the April 11, 2012 public hearing minutes as submitted. Clay
18 WALKER seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.

19
20 April 11, 2012 Assembly Regular Meeting-

21 Clay WALKER MOVED to approve the April 11, 2012 regular meeting minutes as submitted. John
22 WINKLMANN seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.

23 24 REPORTS

25 March 2012 Financial Report

26 Clay WALKER MOVED to receive the March 2012 financial report. John WINKLMANN seconded.
27 The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.

28 29 PLANNING COMMISSION

30 Seat A resignation: Julia Potter

31 John WINKLMANN MOVED to accept the resignation of Julia Potter from Planning Commission
32 Seat A. Rusty LASELL seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.

33
34 Seat F appointment: Molly (Mary) McKinley

35 John WINKLMANN MOVED to confirm Mayor Talerico's appointment of Molly McKinley to Planning
36 Commission Seat F. Clay WALKER seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.

37 38 MEETING RECESS

39 Presiding Officer Robert KOHLSDORF called a recess at 6:57 pm. The meeting reconvened at 7:12
40 pm.

41 42 MAYOR'S REPORT

43 Mayor David Talerico reported that he received a request to attend the May 17 school board
44 meeting in Cantwell, where Apple Computers representative Pete Vraspir will present an award to
45 the Denali Borough School District. The Mayor will be unable to attend, but requested that
46 Assembly members attend. On May 21, the Denali Sportsmen's Club will meet at the Cantwell Café
47 at 6:00 pm. Derelict vehicle car collection dates will be May 26, June 2 and 9, with an informational

1 flyer being sent to all Borough mailbox holders. Currently, there are approximately 70 vehicles that
2 have been brought to the collection site, and there has been interest from organizations to remove
3 the vehicles. Mayor Talerico commended Golden Valley Electric Association for their assistance
4 with this project.

5
6 Mayor Talerico noted that Tri-Valley ETT students received the Spirit of Youth Award, and read their
7 names into the record. Students recognized were; Jesse Arbuckle, Emily Brease, Krys Byfuglien,
8 Zach Cizmowski, Teal O'Connor, Noah Schieber, David Townsend, Shelby Townsend, and
9 Samantha White.

10
11 Tri-Valley student and Denali Borough intern Emily Brease produced the last Denali Dispatch for this
12 school year, and has done a great job with this publication.

13
14 Former Assembly member Jerry Mueller passed away recently. Mr. Mueller served on the Borough
15 formation committee, served on the Assembly from 1991 – 2002, including service as Presiding
16 Officer. Mr. Mueller chaired the Land Use Planning Committee in 1992, and was also a candidate in
17 a close race for mayor.

18
19 Mayor Talerico reported that he had emailed business operators Ordinance 11-24 for comment, and
20 received one comment in return.

21 SCHOOL REPORT

22 There was no school report.

23 ASSEMBLY COMMENTS

24
25 Rusty LASELL disclosed that he is currently serving as the Tri-Valley Volunteer Fire Department
26 (TVVFD) Fire Chief, and that he works with the summer ETT intern program.

27
28 Clay WALKER congratulated the ETT students on the Spirit of Youth award, and voiced support
29 of providing some funding for the program.

30
31 John WINKLMANN had no comment.

32
33 Terry ASBURY thanked the audience for attending the meeting.

34
35 Gordon CARLSON commented that the proposed well in the Cantwell community is for
36 individuals, not a commercial well. Mr. Carlson also commented that there will be a small road
37 project in Cantwell, and there is a grass roots effort to widen the shoulder to create a walk/bike
38 lane. He advised Healy residents to take note and start now if they would like to request a
39 similar modification to road projects in their area.

40
41 Paddy TATUM thanked the audience for attending the meeting.

42
43 Robert KOHLSDORF thanked Kris Capps for her work in the Denali Borough, and spoke in favor
44 of providing some funding for the summer ETT intern program.

45
46 John WINKLMANN MOVED to fund the TVVFD summer ETT intern program in the amount of
47 \$1,500 from budget line item 4130 Contingency. Gordon CARLSON seconded. Clay WALKER
48 MOVED to amend the motion by increasing the amount to \$1,600. John WINKLMANN
49

1 seconded. It was pointed out that there is a budget line item for this type of contribution. The
2 VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.

3
4 COMMUNICATION AND APPEARANCES

5 Ken Spiers, Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC), to discuss medical
6 and bio-hazard waste at the Denali Borough Landfill.

7
8 Ken Spiers, Environmental Program Specialist with DEC, stated that it is illegal to put untreated
9 medical waste from a facility into a landfill. When red bags indicating untreated medical waste enter
10 the landfill, workers must consider them as medical waste and this creates a problem, as red bags
11 should go to a treatment center. If a red bag is received at the landfill, and the source is locatable, it
12 may be legal to keep it in the landfill. However, the implication of a red bag is that it contains
13 medical waste. DEC regulations on medical waste are the same as federal regulations. Medical
14 waste is not allowed into a landfill unless it has been treated. Landfill employees are not to open a
15 red bag if it is brought to the landfill.

16
17 Sean Dewalt, Alaska Municipal League, Joint Insurance Agency (AMLJIA), to discuss
18 medical and bio-hazard waste at the Denali Borough Landfill.

19
20 Sean Dewalt, AMLJIA Risk Management Specialist, informed the Assembly that AMLJIA has been
21 the Borough's partner in risk since 1993, and congratulated the Borough on its exemplary safety
22 record. He stated that people are the number one asset of the Borough. The issue of blood borne
23 pathogens is a serious one. Mr. Dewalt informed the Assembly that businesses with more than ten
24 employees are required to provide their employees with red bags, and to train their employees in
25 their use. Alaska Statute Title 18 prohibits a landfill from accepting medical waste until it has been
26 treated. Landfill employees are educated in how to deal with red bags that arrive, and they are
27 doing it right. If the public has been educated and red bags keep coming to the landfill, penalties
28 need to be assessed to dissuade their being brought to the landfill. Mr. Dewalt stressed that it is his
29 job to protect Denali Borough employees and interests.

30
31 DRAFT ORDINANCES

32 ORDINANCE 12-10: An ordinance amending the Denali Borough Code of Ordinances, Chapter
33 3.20.050 titled Management of Funds.

34
35 Clay WALKER MOVED to introduce Ordinance 12-10. Rusty LASELL seconded. Mayor Talerico
36 explained that the ordinance stems from discussion regarding the purpose of the Permanent
37 Investment Fund. The roll call VOTE on the motion to introduce was unanimous.

38
39 Clay WALKER MOVED to postpone Ordinance 12-10 to the next meeting. John WINKLMANN
40 seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.

41
42 PENDING ORDINANCES

43 ORDINANCE 11-24, Version E: An ordinance amending Denali Borough Code of
44 Ordinances, Chapter 6.15 adding Section 6.15.071 titled Regulated Medical Waste.

45
46 Rusty LASELL MOVED to adopt Ordinance 11-24, Version E. Terry ASBURY seconded. Points of
47 discussion that followed include the length of time the ordinance had been before the Assembly, the
48 continued appearance of red bags at the landfill, and the education of the public.

1
2 Clay WALKER MOVED to amend the ordinance by deleting the words "First Offense" from item C.
3 Rusty LASELL seconded. John WINKLMANN MOVED to further amend by adding "that shall be the
4 generator's first offense,". Rusty LASELL seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.
5
6 The VOTE by show of hands on the motion to amend was 6-1 as follows; Ayes – Clay WALKER,
7 John WINKLMANN, Gordon CARLSON, Paddy TATUM, Terry ASBURY, Rusty LASELL, No –
8 Robert KOHLSDORF. The amendment passed.
9
10 Points of discussion that followed include the question if a third offense would ever be reached, the
11 need for penalties that carry weight, and the contents of red bags. Clay WALKER MOVED to delete
12 Section E, and renumber Section F as E. Gordon CARLSON seconded.
13
14 Presiding Officer Robert Kohlsdorf rescinded the chair to Deputy Presiding Officer John Winklmann
15 at 8:29 pm.
16
17 A point of further discussion was the responsibility of employers to train temporary employees.
18
19 Presiding Officer Robert Kohlsdorf resumed the chair at 8:32 pm.
20
21 The VOTE by show of hands on the motion to amend by deleting Section E was 2-5 as follows; Ayes
22 – Clay WALKER, John WINKLMANN, Noes – Paddy TATUM, Gordon CARLSON, Terry ASBURY,
23 Robert KOHLSDORF, Rusty LASELL. The motion failed due to lack of a majority.
24
25 A query was directed to Sean Dewalt regarding the scenario of an insurance claim relating to
26 handling a red bag. Mr. Dewalt responded that workplace controls are in place, but administrative
27 controls are lacking due to there being nothing in Borough code to dissuade the public from breaking
28 the law. The roll call VOTE on the main motion to adopt Ordinance 11-24 was 4-3 as follows; Ayes
29 – Robert KOHLSDORF, Gordon CARLSON, Rusty LASELL, Terry ASBURY, Noes – Clay WALKER,
30 John WINKLMANN, Paddy TATUM. The motion failed due to lack of five votes.
31
32 ORDINANCE 12-01, Version B: An ordinance amending the Denali Borough Code of Ordinances,
33 Chapter 3.21 titled Management of Grants.
34
35 Rusty LASELL MOVED to postpone Ordinance 12-01, Version B indefinitely. Clay WALKER
36 seconded. The roll call VOTE was unanimous.
37
38 ORDINANCE 12-04, Version C: An ordinance amending the Denali Borough Code of Ordinances,
39 Chapter 3.25.100 titled Penalties and Interest.
40
41 Clay WALKER MOVED to postpone Ordinance 12-04, Version C to the next meeting. John
42 WINKLMANN seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.
43
44 ORDINANCE 12-06, Version A: An ordinance amending Denali Borough Code, Chapter 2.05.050
45 titled Compensation of assembly members.
46
47 Clay WALKER MOVED to postpone Ordinance 12-06, Version A to the next meeting. John
48 WINKLMANN seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.
49

1 MEETING RECESS

2 Presiding Officer Robert Kohlsdorf called a meeting recess at 8:47 pm. The meeting reconvened at
3 9:06 pm.

4
5 ORDINANCE 12-07, Version A: An ordinance amending the fiscal year 2012 budget.

6
7 Clay WALKER MOVED to adopt Ordinance 12-07, Version A. Rusty LASELL seconded.

8
9 Gordon Carlson disclosed that he owns a business that benefits from the budget line item 4056
10 Snow Plowing. Rusty Lasell disclosed that he is the Tri-Valley Fire Department Chief. Neither
11 disclosure was viewed as significant to cause a recusal from voting on the entire ordinance.

12
13 The VOTE on the motion to adopt Ordinance 12-07, Version A was 5 – 2 as follows; Ayes – Paddy
14 TATUM, Gordon CARLSON, Robert KOHLSDORF, Rusty LASELL, Clay WALKER, Noes – Terry
15 ASBURY, John WINKLMANN. The motion passed.

16
17 ORDINANCE 12-08, Version A: An ordinance for the establishment and adoption of the fiscal year
18 2013 budget.

19
20 John WINKLMANN MOVED to postpone Ordinance 12-08 to the next meeting. Gordon CARLSON
21 seconded.

22
23 Points of discussion that followed include the need to approve the budget no later than the next
24 meeting, the legislature may approve capital projects that would affect the budget, and the
25 disclosures made earlier in the meeting.

26
27 John WINKLMANN MOVED to amend budget line item 6000 Matching Grants by increasing the
28 amount to \$60,000. Gordon CARLSON seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.

29
30 Rusty LASELL MOVED to amend budget line item 5200 Nonprofit Contributions by increasing the
31 amount to \$65,815, adding \$8,400 for the Denali Chamber of Commerce. Clay WALKER seconded.
32 It was noted that the Chamber of Commerce is a 501(c) (6) nonprofit, which was cited as cause to
33 exclude them from receiving matching grant funds.

34
35 Clay WALKER MOVED to amend the motion by decreasing the amount for the Denali Chamber of
36 Commerce to \$7,200 and the total for line item 5200 to \$64,615. John WINKLMANN seconded.
37 The VOTE by show of hands was 6-1 as follows; Ayes – Rusty LASELL, Clay WALKER, Gordon
38 CARLSON, Paddy TATUM, Robert KOHLSDORF, John WINKLMANN, No – Terry ASBURY. The
39 motion passed.

40
41 The VOTE by show of hands on the motion to amend line item 5200 was 5-2 as follows; Ayes –
42 John WINKLMANN, Rusty LASELL, Robert KOHLSDORF, Clay WALKER, Paddy TATUM, Noes –
43 Gordon CARLSON, Terry ASBURY. The motion passed.

44
45 John WINKLMANN MOVED to amend the Solid Waste heading on page 4 by deleting the word
46 Expenses and adding the word Revenue. Gordon CARLSON seconded. The VOTE by show of
47 hands was unanimous.

1 Clay WALKER MOVED to amend budget line item 4202 Land Administration by decreasing the
2 amount to \$124,000. Rusty LASELL seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.

3
4 It was noted that the Anderson Community Library submitted a late application, and was not
5 considered for funding. John WINKLMANN MOVED to invite a representative from the Anderson
6 Library to attend the June meeting. Gordon CARLSON seconded. The VOTE by show of hands
7 was 4-3 as follows; Ayes – Paddy TATUM, Terry ASBURY, Robert KOHLSDORF, John
8 WINKLMANN, Noes – Gordon CARLSON, Clay WALKER, Rusty LASELL. The motion passed.

9
10 The VOTE by show of hands on the main motion to postpone Ordinance 12-08 to the next meeting
11 was unanimous.

12
13 ORDINANCE 12-09, Version A: An ordinance establishing the Denali Borough Capital Improvement
14 program for fiscal year 2013 through fiscal year 2018.

15
16 John WINKLMANN MOVED to postpone Ordinance 12-09, Version A to the next meeting. Clay
17 WALKER seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.

18
19 RESOLUTIONS:

20 RESOLUTION 12-10: A resolution pertaining to the asset allocation of the Denali Borough
21 Permanent Investment Fund.

22
23 John WINKLMANN MOVED to amend by adding a percentage range in item (2) (a) of 75% - 90%.
24 Rusty LASELL seconded. The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.

25
26 John WINKLMANN MOVED to approve Resolution 12-10. Carlson seconded. The roll call VOTE
27 was unanimous.

28
29 RESOLUTION 12-11: A resolution approving unincorporated communities and their respective
30 incorporated non-profit entity participation in the fiscal year 2013 community Revenue Sharing
31 program.

32
33 Clay WALKER MOVED to approve Resolution 12-11. John WINKLMANN seconded. Rusty Lasell
34 disclosed a conflict of interest as TVVFD Fire Chief, Gordon Carlson disclosed a conflict of interest
35 as owner of a business that benefits from services provided to the Cantwell Volunteer Fire
36 Department. The roll call VOTE was unanimous, with Rusty LASELL and Gordon CARLSON having
37 recused themselves from voting.

38
39 RESOLUTION 12-12: A resolution committing support and funding for the development of trail-ways
40 to and from schools and other public facilities within the Denali Borough.

41
42 John WINKLMANN MOVED to approve Resolution 12-12. Paddy TATUM seconded. It was noted
43 that Mayor Talerico provided the Assembly with information regarding an encroachment permit for
44 road right of way, and that specific areas need to be identified. The roll call VOTE on the motion to
45 approve Resolution 12-12 was unanimous.

46
47 RESOLUTION 12-13: A resolution to appropriate Capital Projects funding for the development and
48 support of Borough-wide shooting ranges.

1 John WINKLMANN MOVED to approve Resolution 12-13. Paddy TATUM seconded. Clay WALKER
2 MOVED to amend by deleting “appropriate” from the title and inserting “support,” as well as adding
3 the word “consider” to the last sentence of the resolution. Points of discussion that followed include
4 the need for grass roots support of shooting range projects and the lack of an identified location.
5 The roll call VOTE on the motion to approve Resolution 12-13 was 3-4 as follows; Ayes – John
6 WINKLMANN, Clay WALKER, Paddy TATUM, Noes – Gordon CARLSON, Terry ASBURY, Robert
7 KOHLSDORF, and Rusty LASELL. The motion failed due to the lack of five votes needed to pass.

8
9 OTHER BUSINESS

10
11 Spirit of Youth certificate presentation to Student Emergency Trauma Technicians

12 Mayor David Talerico recognized the Tri-Valley ETT students being awarded the Spirit of Youth
13 Award. Mayor Talerico thanked Kris Capps for nominating the students.

14

21 It was noted that there was a typographical error on the approval paperwork, that the applicant is
22 Skyline Lodge. The applicant has been in business about eight years, and is applying for a permit to
23 provide beer and house wines to only their clients. There has been no negative comment regarding
24 this business.

25
26 Clay WALKER MOVED to approve Liquor License number 5155. John WINKLMANN seconded.
27 The VOTE by show of hands was unanimous.

28
29 PUBLIC COMMENTS

30 Kris Capps invited Assembly members to upcoming community engagement meetings in their own
31 communities. Community coordinators are Justin Mason in Cantwell, Kris Capps in Healy, and
32 Jamie Wagner in Anderson. In April, several Borough residents attended Arts Training of
33 Promoters, and now may apply for grants in their communities for arts projects that partner youths
34 and adults. The Fairbanks Summer Arts Festival will feature a Denali National Park Project, where a
35 16-piece orchestra, including the group Sweet Plantain, will perform in the Park on July 21. There
36 also will be a composer workshop, with composers from around the world. The 49th State Brewing
37 Company will brew a special beer and donate one dollar from each sold to Kids in Motion/Denali
38 Arts and Humanities Alliance. The third season of collaboration with the Fairbanks Concert
39 Association has just ended, and will continue next year with Riders in the Sky performing locally in
40 the fall. Ms. Capps thanked all for their support of the Denali Arts and Humanities Alliance.

41
42 ASSEMBLY COMMENTS
